"As a retired FBI Supervisory Special Agent and former Director of Counterintelligence, Intelligence and Security Programs for the FBI, International Spy Museum Board Member David Major will discuss the most important spy cases from around the globe in 2012 and 2013. This discussion is a worldwide overview of espionage and terrorism todaythe trends, threats, and evolution of today's

intelligence to the United States. This seminar explores how many individuals have been indicted in the US for espionage-related crimes from 1945 to the present and terrorist plots in the USA since September 11, 2001. This discussion will explores how aggressive China is in stealing information and analyze the reality of Russia as an espionage threat to Europe and North America. This seminar is based on information his organization, the CI Centre, collects and analyzes and then makes available to members via SPYPEDIA®, the world's largest resource for information on, and analysis of, worldwide espionage, terrorism, and cyber security."



Michael Chertoff was the second United Staes Secretary of Homeland Security under President George W. Bush and co-author of the USA PATRIOT Act. He previously served as a judge on the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit, as a federal prosecutor, and as Assistant U.S. Attorney General. He succeeded Tom Ridge as Uned States Secretary of Homeland Security on February 15, 2005.

Since leaving government service, Chertoff has worked as senior counsel at the Washington, D.C., law firm of Covington and Burling. He also cofounder the Chertoff Group, a risk-management and security consulting company, which employs several senior officials from his time as Secretary of Homeland Security as well as Michael Hayden, a former director of the National Security Agency and the Central Intelligence Agency.
