### ***About the NSA/CSS Hall of Honor:***

*The Hall of Honor, created in 1999, pays tribute to the pioneers and heroes who have made significant and enduring contributions to American cryptology. There are two basic criteria for nomination to the NSA/CSS Hall of Honor. First, an individual or group must have made significant contributions through cryptology to America's national security or had a lifetime of high achievement in the cryptologic field. In addition, an individual must have been retired from cryptologic service for a minimum of 10 years.*

### ***About this years' inductees:***

#### **Mr. Richard (Dick) L. Bernard**

*For more than 30 years, he pioneered advanced technical projects and made them operational. He was instrumental in developing technical sources of intelligence vital to NSA's Cold War mission set, and he successfully negotiated with domestic and international partners to achieve mutually beneficial outcomes.*

#### **Mr. Seymour R. Cray (Deceased)**

*He developed supercomputers that NSA found indispensable. He significantly advanced NSA computing abilities through his computer systems and computer system components, including the magnetic drum for data storage and the BOGART system, the first NSA computer allowing access from remote terminals. His inventions made it possible for NSA to address a number of previously intractable analytic challenges.*

#### **Mr. Michael J. Jacobs**

*He modernized NSA's information assurance mission, maximizing NSD-42 authorities to lead the Government-industry-academia partnership necessary to effectively secure and protect NSA information and information systems. He established and nurtured the Centers of Academic Excellence Cyber Program, which includes more than 200 universities' cyber-related degree programs, graduating the next generation of cyber warriors.*

**Ms. Hilda Faust Mathieu**

*The visionary and one of the driving forces behind NSA's computer network operations activities, she recognized and addressed computer and network security issues, helping to develop security controls and initiate the computer network exploitation concept. Though initially met with opposition, she persisted and was critical in driving telecommunications and research organizations toward innovative approaches to the emerging cyber mission.*

**Mr. Whitney E. Reed**

*He revolutionized NSA education and training at the National Cryptologic School (NCS). He created and formalized the Adjunct Faculty program, ensuring trained educators possessing current and relevant mission experience responsive to student needs. He also implemented physical and organizational improvements to the NCS.*

*Proceed directly to the Vehicle Control Point #1 (VCP 1)  
where your name will appear on the Director's Access List.  
Be prepared to show photo identification  
(do not go to the Visitor Control Center).*

*Proceed to the traffic signal and make a right turn onto Towler Road. Proceed straight to Post 52, where you will receive a VIP parking pass.  
This pass must be clearly displayed in your vehicle to allow you to park in the reserved area. Failure to display the permit will result in a parking violation that is not disputable by the recipient.  
Once you have been cleared through the Post, follow the signs directing you to VIP Parking.*

*Guest decals will be issued in the OPS2B Special Events Center.  
You will then be escorted to the OPS2A/B Cafeteria.*

**Approved alternate forms of identification include:** U.S. Passport, U.S. Passport ID Card, Foreign Government Passport, U.S. Military ID (active duty or retired military and their dependents and DoD civilians), U.S. Government Issued Common Access Card (CAC), U.S. Government Issued Official Credentials (i.e. NSA, CIA, FBI, etc.), DHS Enhanced DL(+) (must state "Enhanced" at top of license and issued by Michigan, Minnesota, Vermont, New York, and Washington State), U.S. Government issued HSPD-12 PIV Card Transportation Worker Identification Card (TWIC), DHS Trusted Traveler cards (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST), U.S. Department of Defense ID, including ID's issued to dependents (Photo copies of any of the above will not be accepted).

## Directions to NSA VIP Parking (in E4 Lot)

### From MD 32:

#### 1. Exit MD 32 at “Canine Road – NSA” (Exit 10A)

From MD 32 East:

- Follow ramp under MD 32 overpass.
- Shift into right lane.

From MD 32 West:

- Follow ramp to Canine Road.
- Stay in right lane.

2. From right lane, proceed straight through traffic signal to VCP-1.
3. Stop at VCP-1 checkpoint, state purpose of your visit to Police Officer.
4. Proceed in right lane to traffic signal, Turn Right onto Towler Road.
5. Proceed straight to & stop at Post 52, state purpose of visit to Police Officer.
6. Proceed straight, go 3/4 way around traffic circle (turn left).
7. Proceed slowly & stop at end of N3 Parking Lot.
8. VIP parking area is straight ahead (in adjacent E4 Lot).
