This Month in Cryptologic History



21 February 1846: Sarah G. Bagley became the first female telegrapher. (Lowell, MA). She was also an activist for labor nearly a century before unions were legal, and was committed to improving health care and education for women, men, and children. She wrote and contributed articles to the "Lowell Offering."

In addition to tapping out messages, Sarah helped people write them. Early in 1847, she was contracted to run the magnetic telegraph office in Springfield, MA. She was very unhappy to discover she earned only two-thirds as much as the man she replaced. This further inspired her commitment to human equality and the rights of women.
